Gallup, New Mexico is a city in northwest New Mexico, USA near the Four Corners region. Founded in 1881, the town draws its name from David L. Gallup, a paymaster for the Atlantic and Pacific Railroad (later part of the Santa Fe Railroad).

Workforce >>>

The Gallup / McKinley County region has a total population of nearly 75,000, and a labor force of more than 25,000.

There are 3 college institutions within McKinley County:

- UNM Gallup
- Navajo Technical University
- Diné College Crownpoint

The regional labor force offers an availability of skilled positions and deep reserve of semi-skilled and entry-level workers.

Labor costs for the region are extremely competitive with southwest US marketplaces. The 2010 average salary per job in the County was \$32,364.

Incentives >>>

The Gallup / McKinley County region provides several local and state incentives to compete effectively for business:

- Local Economic Development Act (LEDA)
- Rural Jobs Tax Credit
- Job Training Incentive Program (JTIP)

LEDA allows a community the power to finance the purchase of land, buildings, or infrastructure in exchange for job creation.

Rural Jobs tax credits can be applied to taxes due on state gross receipts or corporate income tax.

JTIP funds classroom and onthe-job training for newlycreated jobs in expanding or relocating businesses for up to 6 months, reimbursing 50-75% of employee wages.


The Gallup / McKinley County region offers easy access to major and international markets.

Interstate Highway 40 connects Gallup to both coasts of the United States. I-40 intersects with eight of the 10 primary north – south interstates.

The BNSF Railway's Southern Transcon is rail's super highway. It connects McKinley County to the Pacific Ocean (Long Beach, Los Angeles, and Oakland) and to the Gulf of Mexico (Houston).

Navajo Gallup Water Supply Project – "Water Infrastructure for Economic Growth" >>>

The Navajo-Gallup Water Supply Project is a major infrastructure project that once constructed, will convey a reliable municipal and industrial water supply from the San Juan River to the city of Gallup via 280 miles of pipeline, several pumping plants, and two water treatment plants.

- City water allocation will be 7,500 acre feet per year
- City investment into project: \$75,000,000
- Total Project Cost: Est. \$1,000,000,000
