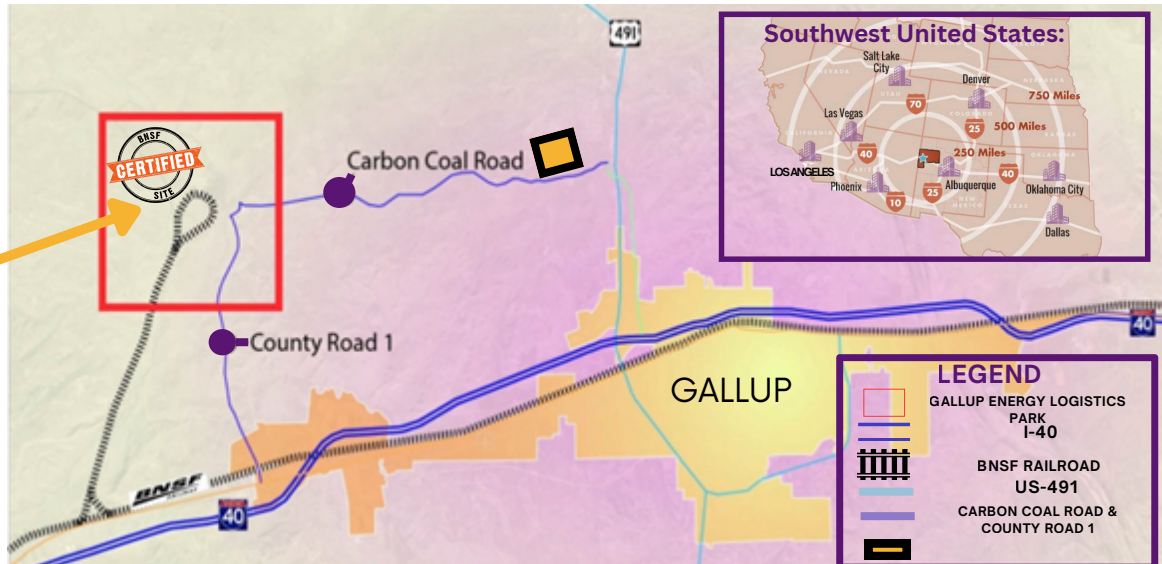


LOCATION HIGHLIGHTS

The Gallup Energy Logistics Park (GELP) is a ±2,500-acre rail-served industrial site in Gallup, New Mexico, anchored by a 365-acre BNSF-Certified parcel. Zoned heavy industrial, it features ~20,000 linear feet of looped rail with direct BNSF mainline access, supporting efficient logistics, manufacturing, and transload operations. Strategically located along Carbon Coal Road with access to US-491 and I-40, GELP offers strong connectivity and flexible parcelization for large, rail-dependent users making it one of the region's largest contiguous rail-served sites. Designated under New Mexico's Site Readiness Program and annexed into the City of Gallup, the site is advancing toward project readiness with planned power, fiber, and water infrastructure, including interim well service. Located within a federal Qualified Opportunity Zone, GELP provides a scalable platform for industrial and economic growth.

TOPOGRAPHY, BUILDINGS & ENVIRONMENTAL

The site features generally developable terrain with gentle topography. Existing improvements include an approximately 30,000 SF mechanical building, which can be repositioned with upgrades to support future industrial use. GELP is located within a federal air quality attainment area under EPA regulations.

WORKFORCE CAPACITY & TRAINING

McKinley County has a civilian workforce of 24,122, with 12,718 workers residing in Gallup (FRED Data, Apr. 8 2026 & U.S. Census QuickFacts, City of Gallup, Feb. 6 2026). The Southwest Indian Foundation offers a customizable industrial workforce training program with trade instruction and stackable NCCER credentials. Additional technical and industrial training is provided by the University of New Mexico–Gallup, Navajo Technical University, and New Mexico State University–Grants. A recent workforce study identified up to 1,000 workers ready for employment in key sectors, including energy, transportation and logistics, and manufacturing.



FIBER LOCATION & PROVIDERS

Commnet/Sacred Wind Communications tele-communications lines are located at US Highway 491 and Chino Road, approx. 3,000 feet east of the industrial park. Sacred Wind's average speed is 15.6 Mbps.

ELECTRIC PROVIDERS & SUBSTATION

PROVIDER: The City of Gallup Electric Department provides 3-Phase Electric Service to areas of GELP within its service area (336 ACSR with Ampacity of 250 and 90 currently).

NEAREST SUBSTATION: The Allison Substation is located 5 miles southwest of GELP. The Power Transformer is 115kV – 13.2/7.6kV, 15/20/25 MVA with LTC.



NATURAL GAS

The New Mexico Gas Company will provide service to GELP. Energy Transfer's Transwestern Pipeline [a 30" natural gas line, 750 DTH/Day at 700-800SIG (& MAOP of 1008 PSTG)] runs approximately 1/4 mile north of the site.



WATER & WASTEWATER

The City of Gallup will provide water service to GELP. Water service will tie into a 14" line being installed along Carbon Coal Road. The City of Gallup also provides effluent water. Gallup Land Partners will also provide water to businesses in the industrial park.



INCENTIVE PROGRAMS

Local Economic Development Act (LEDA) & Industrial Revenue Bonds (IRB) support land, fixed equipment & machinery acquisition and development. **Job Training Incentive Program, Rural Jobs Tax Credit, and High Wage Jobs Tax Credits** support hiring local, rural workers and job training. Other Tax credits include **Gross Receipt Tax (GRT) Deduction for Manufacturers, Investment Tax Credit, and New Markets Tax Credit**. Investors should not as well that the entire city of Gallup is within a **Federal Qualifying Opportunity Zone**
